



Made in America Warns Voters that a Biden Win Will Usher in a Socialist Government

This year's election is the most important election in our lifetime; the Democrats continue to embrace socialism; Maria Salazar faces a tough battle against Donna Shalala in Florida's 27th district; Florida's Cuban population despises socialism after seeing how it destroyed Cuba; Amy Coney Barret will be sworn in as the 115th Supreme Court justice; it is doubtful that the Democrats will be successful "packing the court;" there is talk about having Puerto Rico and Washington D.C. become states, were among the topics discussed by Neal Asbury and Dr. Rich Roffman on the nationally syndicated "Neal Asbury's Made in America" show on Radio America (aired by almost 100 affiliates and globally on the Armed Forces Network).

Neal began the show by characterizing this election as the most important in our lifetime as it could usher in a socialist government.

Dr. Roffman urged listeners to vote and bring your neighbors with you.

The first guest on Made in America was Maria Elvira Salazar, a Cuban American journalist and broadcast television anchor who worked for the Spanish-language network Telemundo for three decades after serving as a news anchor for Miami-based Mega TV. She has also worked for CNN Español and Univision. She has appeared on Fox News and Fox Business. She was the Republican candidate for Florida's 27th congressional district in 2018 and faces off against Democratic

incumbent Rep. Donna Shalala again in 2020.

"The Democrats have been hijacked by the Far Left, and as we've seen in Venezuela and Cuba, socialism destroys a country and its people. That is why I am running against Donna Shalala to expand a free marketplace and help small businesses prosper. Donna has a sense of entitlement and doesn't even bother to visit her own district," according to Salazar.

Neal agreed, noting that Shalala ran the corrupt Clinton Foundation, which was a piggy bank for the Clintons.

According to Dr. Roffman, the solution to stopping Shalala is to vote, and bring 5 or 6 neighbors with you.

The next guest on Made in America was John Malcolm, Vice President, Institute for Constitutional Government, Director of the Meese Center for Legal & Judicial Studies and Senior Legal Fellow at the Heritage Foundation.

Malcolm admired the way Amy Coney Barret conducted herself during the hearings as she was being attacked by Democrats. He predicted that she would easily be confirmed. (NOTE: THIS SHOW WAS TAPED PRIOR TO HER TAKING THE OATH OF OFFICE ON OCTOBER 26).

"While the hearings were nasty, they weren't as nasty as the Kavanaugh hearings. Barret was vetted by the FBI and no concerns were raised. The Democrats keep hinting that they will 'pack the court' by adding two or more justices. But even FDR could not make this happen. Biden has refused to

discuss this," according to Malcolm.

Dr. Roffman maintained that the two-party rule is over.

Malcom believes that there is momentum to add Puerto Rico and Washington D.C. as new states. He thinks Puerto Rico has a better chance than Washington D.C.
