

Made in America Warns that Political Correctness is Undermining our Way of Life and the U.S. Economy

Democrats lining up behind the New Green Deal; the peril of eliminating fossil fuels from our domestic energy program; the inadequacy of renewable energy to generate the electrical capacity our industrial base requires; the illconceived initiative by private investment in a space program; how being politically correct is undermining our way of life; and the Left's embrace of socialism that threatens our economy, were among the topics tackled by host Neal Asbury, cohost Dr. Rich Roffman, and a panel of experts on the nationally syndicated "Neal Asbury's Made in America" show on Radio America (aired by almost 100 affiliates and the Armed Forces Network).

Neal and Dr. Roffman began the show by castigating Democrats for lining up to support the New Green Deal, which is aimed at outlawing fossil fuels, which would put the country into a disastrous energy crisis.

"The New Green Deal is just like the way Democrats lined up to support Obamacare, acting on something without understanding it. But leading Democrats like Michael Bloomberg, Kirsten Gillibrand, and Kamala Harris are all on board," according to Neal.

Dr. Roffman agreed, noting that the progressive media have manufactured an energy crisis, and now Democrats have turned so far to the Left on energy, that they have lost touch with the nation's heritage. "What a huge mistake to threaten to phase out fossil fuels in 12 years, which would eliminate jobs and sink the economy."

The first guest on Made in America was David Turner, executive director of Power the Future, who disdain's Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren, who after becoming the first Democrat to announce a 2020 presidential bid, wasted no time pivoting to the far-left, quickly championing Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez's radical "Green New Deal," a socialist pipe dream that is quickly becoming a litmus test for 2020 Dems. The energy discussion is just cover for a wider conversation about redistributing wealth.

"The Green New Deal is high on cost and low on details. It calls for decarbonizing industries under the guise of environmental justice and equality. The deal includes a Bernie Sanders-style universal healthcare system and a basic income scheme. It is supposedly an environmental platform that Ocasio-Cortez is demanding the Democratic Party adopt, but in reality, it reads as a laundry list of socialist policies," according to Turner, who quipped that the deal looks like it was cobbled together by interns over a weekend. "While many people support renewable energy, it has no critical mass. Wind and solar energy cannot produce the megawatts necessary to produce the electricity required by the nation. But with fossil fuels, we can meet our energy needs and have the surplus to export to China, where they are already importing American coal. It gives us strategic dominance over China," opined Dr. Roffman.

The discussion turned to the growing number of private companies investing in space programs, including Elon Musk's SpaceX division, which is laying off 10 percent of its workforce. Virgin Airlines and Amazon are also investing in space exploration.

Neal wondered when America stopping honoring the nation's thinkers and inventors that helped make America great. "We should respect the wealthy and their accomplishments and the risks they took to get there. They should be emulated because they pursued the American Dream," proposed Neal.

Dr. Roffman agreed, reminding listeners what this nation and what the world would look like if Edison had not harnessed electricity and railroads and cars were not built. "Applaud the people who made money with their wits and sacrifice –don't be jealous of their wealth."

The next guest on Made in America was Nick Adams, founder of the Foundation for Liberty and American Greatness, who is an immigrant from Australia and the author of "Retaking America, Crushing Political Correctness," which contends that political correctness has ripped through America, turning life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness into lifelessness, suppression and the pursuit of mediocrity. Only America has the cure, but will America be able to save itself in time, and lead a stunning turnaround-or will it succumb to a European fate?

"Political correctness isn't just about speech --it has to do with life -- a mindset that requests Americans to strive for mediocrity. It's not about how much butt you kiss, it is how much butt you kick. Political correctness is turning the American Dream into a European nightmare," according to Adams.

Dr. Roffman agreed, proposing that the Democrats have been hijacked by the Left; the same way that the Left hijacked Obama's administration.

"The Left is very dangerous with their PC mentality, pushing Americans into political quicksand. But it is America's duty to be as a non-

PC as possible. The Left doesn't want us to be clear speaking, which is terrifying," concluded Adams.

The show ended with Neal and Dr. Roffman looking at the recent Davos meeting which saw hundreds of people pushing for a low carbon footprint, while flying into Davos on 1,500 private jets.

"While workers are worrying about minimum wage, they should be worrying about artificial intelligence, which is quickly displacing low-skilled workers such as truck drivers, chefs, and fast food preparers," concluded Neal.
