

Made in America Panel Proposes that Democratic Embrace of Socialism Will Doom the Party in 2020 Election.

The Democratic debates clearly indicate that the party is embracing socialism; the debate performance is handing Trump a victory in 2020; the Democrats have no solutions to any challenge facing the country, and have never accepted the outcome of the 2016 election; Joe Biden appears to be unprepared for a presidential run; the stakes for a trade deal of some sort with China is critical for both leaders; there's no doubt that China is intent on world domination; Trump's strong stance against China is the right way to go; Bill De Blasio demonstrates the peril of pandering to a Hispanic audience by speaking Spanish; were among the topics tackled by host Neal Asbury, co-host Dr. Rich Roffman, and a panel of experts on the nationally syndicated "Neal Asbury's Made in America" show on Radio America (aired by almost 100 affiliates and the Armed Forces Network).

Neal and Dr. Roffman began the show by noting that if there was any question that the Democratic Party has drifted toward socialism, the question was answered during the Democratic debates. "We are watching Democrats slowly diminish economic freedom and the future of entrepreneurs," according to Neal.

Dr. Roffman suggested that President Trump must have been happy watching the Democratic debates since they are handing him the election with their lackluster ideas and drift toward socialism.

The first guest on Made in America was returning guest, Liz Harrington, RNC spokesperson, who proposed that the Democratic debate seemed to have been designed to see how many socialists can fit on one stage at one time.

"They have really bought into the usual socialism promises of free healthcare and free education, which will destroy our economy and individual freedom. They talked down about the economy, ignoring Trump's pro-growth achievements. How can we ignore the fact that 162 million Americans have jobs while continuing to maintain that millions of people are holding down multiple jobs to make ends meet? There is simply no evidence of that," proposed Harrington, who added that even she was taken aback when Bernie Sanders promised that if he is elected president he will start "the revolution" as his first priority.

Dr. Roffman quipped that the Democrats reminded him of little kids sitting on Santa's lap to ask for every toy they can think of for Christmas without understanding that Santa can't fulfill all their wishes.

"The Democrats have never accepted the results of the 2016 election, ignoring the fact that

Trump spoke directly to voters while Democrats basically ignored them. They need to look in the mirror and ask who they are, and where did they go wrong," according to Harrington.

Neal's take on the debates is that Joe Biden simply cannot go toe-to-toe with Trump and expect to win.

Harrington agreed, noting that Biden has never been a front-runner and seemed unprepared for the debate. "He is such a weak candidate. He keeps talking about the changes that occurred under Obama, but they weren't good changes. And now we have Democrats who want to unravel Obamacare – the big achievement of the Obama administration."

The next guest on Made in America was Anders Corr, founder of Corr Analytics, which provides analysis to government and business clients, with a focus on strategic and international political risk.

Corr is devoting most of his analysis to the ongoing negotiations between China's Xi and Trump on a potential trade agreement.

"There are trillions of dollars involved and Trump is doing a good job leveraging America's economic power against China, like no other president. But aside from trade, Trump needs to press China about human rights and religious freedom. In fact, China is holding two Australian diplomats in a prison," according to Corr, who wants to see other countries make China accountable for their actions.

Neal proposed that China and the U.S. are playing a game of chicken. Neither leader can look like they are backing off. Yet, both wish to find a way to make a deal.

Dr. Roffman agreed, adding that China is playing a long-term strategy, and doubts that either party is ready to concede anything.

"China's plan is nothing short of world domination. Trump sees this and is not willing to give them an edge that will help them achieve their goals. Xi is vulnerable, as companies doing business with China are starting to take a hit on profits. But the U.S. can't take China for granted since they continue to dump cheap steel, and steal technology while building up their navy," noted Corr.

Dr. Roffman agreed, but he likes to see Trump stand up to China.

Dr. Roffman returned to the topic of the debates where he revealed that Bill De Blasio's quote in Spanish, which was meant to be inspirational, was actually attributed to Che Guevara – a figure despised by the Cuban population living in Florida as he was a chief Marxist killer for Fidel Castro.

Neal took exception to Democrats that seemed to imply that it's the job of the average American to work so that the government will have money to spend. "Meanwhile Democrats continue to attack Trump, even as the stock market has hit highs not seen since 1938."
